#### Spectrum of research practices

How it should be done:

Relevant, Valid, Reproducible, Efficient

Sloppy science:

Ignorance, honest error or dubious integrity

Scientific fraud:

Fabrication, Falsification, Plagiarism



## Forms of Plagiarism

## Plagiarism is the appropriation of other's people's material without giving proper credit

- Word-for-word plagiarism
- Paraphrasing plagiarism
- Plagiarism of ideas
- •Unintentional plagiarism
- Self-plagiarism



## Impact of Plagiarism

- Little impact on validity of knowledge
- Substantial impact on trust between scientists
- Substantial impact on trust in science
- Less impact than F + F
- Not always RM



#### Ranking research misbehavior

60 items ranked by 34/59 experts at 4th WCRI



#### The Case - accusation

- Anonymous allegation of self-plagiarism in 16 publications
- High profile professor of economy (2,400 publications)
- 'Character assassination' in major newspaper
- ■Investigation → Research Misconduct
- 2 articles retracted by Review of Economic Analysis
- ■Appeal → NO Research Misconduct
- Self-plagiarism not in NL Code of Conduct memorandum
- Investigation of complete oeuvre

#### The Memorandum -1

- Self-plagiarism doesn't exist → stealing from oneself is not possible
- Core topic: re-use of material without reference to its source
- Referencing the source is the norm
- Labelled as quotation if word-for-word re-use of text is at issue
- Re-use can be verbatim, summarized, paraphrased, translated
- Impact (adverse effects) depends on a number of factors
- Re-use of material without reference to its source
  - → RM, QRP or no problem



#### The Memorandum -2

- Allow for the factors from the table
- Take into account the extent, frequency and context of re-use
- Re-use of material with reference can also be a QRP, e.g.
  - deliberate over- or under-citation
  - distorted citation
- Referencing all sources is impossible and not necessary
  - ideas may have become common knowledge
  - same ideas can often be found in in multiple materials

#### The Memorandum - 3

- Involve peers in judgments on accusations of (self-)plagiarism
- Do not confuse plagiarism with violation of copyright
- Update the NL Code of Conduct
- Do not apply rules that did not yet exist
- Plagiarism Scanners have serious limitations
- Discussion will continue



#### The Case - verdict

- Committee investigating complete oeuvre used the Memorandum
- Re-use of own or coauthored articles without reference to its source
- Peer reviewed 'born digital' articles since 1995 in university database
- Analysis with iThenticate followed by manual interpretation of re-use
- 60 of 261 articles re-used strings of > 50 consecutive words
- Publication strategy: quantity above originality
- No RM (plagiarism), but clearly QRP

#### Conclusions

- Plagiarism has little impact on truth, but moderate impact on trust
- Referencing the source of re-used material is the norm
- Not referencing can be RM, QRP or no problem
- Depending on
  - What is the function of the re-use in the paper?
  - Is the author that re-uses without referencing (co-)author?
- Always involve peers in judgments on accusations of plagiarism
